This is to ensure the privacy and safety of all friends and members. While it can seem disheartening to not see a prayer list in print every week, please rest assured that each and every person on the prayer list will be held in prayer. God knows our minds and hearts and will hear our prayers. I read an article on the power of group prayer and I would like to share some points that I found to be most uplifting:

- "1. The power of group prayer is magnified by the sense of community it fosters. Coming together as a community to pray enhances the collective intent and energy, making the prayers more potent.
- 2. The collective energy of group prayers is not limited to physical boundaries. It extends beyond space and time, allowing individuals to channel their intentions and prayers to specific goals or individuals who may be in need.
- 3. Group prayer plays a crucial role in building emotional resilience. When individuals face challenging or traumatic experiences, group prayer provides a supportive and nurturing space for emotional healing and growth" (Godsverse, 2023).

The world continually evolves, and so we, too, must adapt. This should not mean that our prayers and caring for others should be hindered. Let us be even more fervent in our prayers for Trinity, for one another and for our world. Please pray for our new pastor, who we have not yet met; for our Interim pastor who continues to lead us; the synod and all of those responsible for helping Trinity navigate through the transition process; and for each and every volunteer at Trinity who serves and provides continuity to the church during this transitional period.

Trinity Spotlight

My name is Evy Okerstrom; I am the Council liaison for the Education Team at Trinity. I have been very fortunate to be able to share my artwork with the Members and Friends of Trinity for the last few years. I am a member of the Artists' Workshop of New Smyrna Beach, and they host Community Galleries here in New Smyrna Beach, Edgewater, and Port Orange. Several years ago, I was given permission to have our Fellowship Hall be part of their program. It is an opportunity for local artists to exhibit their artwork. There is a large art community here and I thought it would give Trinity some exposure to what we have to offer the community. The current exhibit in the Fellowship Hall has been mostly my work. Since Covid, it has been hard to find artists to hang their work anywhere. I plan on changing the current paintings with some of my newer artwork. However, everyone is invited to hang a painting in the Fellowship Hall. It does not have to be one you painted. Let me know if this interests you.

For the past year, I have also been teaching art classes each Wednesday from p.m. to p.m. in the Fellowship Hall. I have a small group of 4 or 5 ladies. I have had men attend too. I have been teaching at the Hub on Canal also, but only a few months each year. A number of my students from the Hub are now coming to Trinity classes. This has been good for several of my students who are handicapped, and the parking is much better here.

My course is "Sketching with Watercolor, Pen and Ink". In late May, I will be teaching a series on watercolor techniques. We will use Sarah Simon's Workbook #1. This book provides essential tools and information for beginners as well as those with experience. It even includes real watercolor paper and paint mixing instructions.

I have been very blessed to be able to offer these classes at Trinity, and I enjoy teaching. It is a wonderful feeling to help someone discover that they can draw and paint. I do charge a fee for each class; a portion of what I receive is given back to the church. This giving back is very important to me.

Lutheran World Relief Kits

I would like to thank everyone who contributed to the Lutheran World Relief personal care kits and baby kits. We have assembled and packed 32 personal care kits and 18 baby kits to be sent along with the quilts when they are sent by truck to Maryland for distribution again. We will also be assembling school kits in August to send also. I would also like to thank Else Abel for her Thrivent Grant which was used for the baby kits also.

I was able to get exceptional buys on items needed for our baby kits at Carter's outlets and Wal-Mart clearance sales. These items were exactly what we were looking for at great prices. As a result of this, we were able to assemble more baby kits than we would have been able to without these prices. We can send double the amount we were able to send this past year. As a result of this, we have decided to start up a fund if anyone is interested in donating to it, where monies will be placed so the funds will be available to purchase at future sales. The manager at Carter's is going to contact me when they run these sales 4 times a year so we can take advantage of these lower prices. The baby kits are very costly to put together with the items requested. This will allow us to shop for the best deals. If anyone is interested in donating to this worthy cause, please write baby kits in the memo area of your check to the church or put baby kits on your envelope if you are giving cash donations so they are deposited to the right account. Thank you for your consideration of this cause.

Also, if you knit or crochet, we can use receiving blankets made with lightweight yarn, between 36" and 52" square. Each kit has 2 receiving blankets in them. Also, we can use sweaters and baby caps. If you are interested in making any of these items for the future baby kits, they would truly be appreciated. If you have any questions regarding them, please contact me.

Cantor's Notes

"We believe that the holy act of singing together shapes faith, heals brokenness, transforms lives, and renews peace."

This Is My Father's World, ELW 824, was written by Maltbie D. Babcock (1858-1901). In its original form, it was a poem of sixteen four-line stanzas, each one beginning "This is my Father's world." Babcock was a Presbyterian minister who served prominent churches in Baltimore (where he also worked at Johns Hopkins University) and New York City (where he often made pastoral calls on his bicycle.) Contemporary accounts of Babcock refer to him as an able student, athlete, organist, pianist, violist, composer, woodworker and poet with a sunny disposition and a magnetic personality, highly respected as a dynamic pastor and preacher who cared for all classes of people, including the rich, the poor, and those who were lonely.

This is my Father's world, and to my listening ears all nature sings, and round me rings the music of the spheres.

This is my Father's world; I rest me in the thought of rocks and trees, of skies and seas; his hand the wonders wrought.

This is my Father's world; the birds their carols raise; the morning light, the lily white, declare their maker's praise. This is my Father's world; he shines in all that's fair. In the rustling grass I hear him pass; he speaks to me everywhere.

This is my Father's world; oh, let me not forget that, though the wrong seems oft so strong, God is the ruler yet.
This is my Father's world; why should my heart be sad?
The Lord is king, let heaven ring; God reigns, let earth be glad!
